Executive Summary

The Maryland Department of Planning has forecasted a 2% drop in Allegany County's population from the year 2000 to the year 2010. For the same time period, the Maryland Department of Labor Licensing and Regulation has reported an actual increase of 5% for the labor force for the County. In the year 2000, the labor force was 44% of the actual population. The percentage of the population in the workforce has increased and/or the population overall has increased. Seven of the eight adjacent counties are forecast to increase in population from 2000 to 2010. This includes a 1% increase for Mineral County, which is the other county in the Cumberland MSA. The forecasted gain for Washington County alone is 17,327, or 23% of Allegany County's 2000 population.

Since 1993, the number of births has been below the number of deaths in Allegany County. The gap, however, peaked in 2005 with the number of deaths decreasing and the number of births increasing. The gap has been narrowing since, and is now the smallest it's been since 1993.

Looking at net migration from 2000 to 2008, shows that Allegany County is losing more people to other states than it is gaining from other Maryland counties. However, the amount that the County is losing to other states is declining and the interchange with other Maryland counties went positive in 2004. If the trend for both continues, in a few years we could see consistent positive numbers for total migration for Allegany County. The County had positive total migration in 2004 and 2007.

The changes in the migration table might be explained in general by people moving into our County for more affordable housing and other people moving out for retirement and lower state taxes. Replacing retirees with workers could explain why the population might not increase but the labor force is increasing. The people are moving here from counties to the east that are more expensive for housing. Looking at the period 2000 - 2008, Allegany County is gaining people in net from the Maryland suburbs of Washington D.C., Baltimore City and County, and the state of Virginia. From 2004 - 2007, when the housing market was hot, Allegany County was gaining from Washington County.

The County is losing people in net to the southern, north central and western regions of the United States along with Pennsylvania and West Virginia. The South and the West are traditional places for retirees to move. The net migration loss to West Virginia is notable because it alone equals all the net gains from elsewhere. In 2008, Maryland's tax burden was 10.8%, West Virginia's was 1.3 percentage points lower. Maryland's tax burden rank then was 5th highest out of all the states, while West Virginia's was 26th.

Executive Summary (Continued)

The median selling price of residential units in Allegany County between 2004 and 2007 went up 53.2% compared to 38.9% for Maryland and 12.8% for the United States. The housing bust has driven prices down 7.3% since then in the County, but they are down 20.2% in Maryland and 21.1% in the United States. Price is determined by both supply and demand. The housing stock increased 1.4% between 1990 and 2000 while the population stayed stable. This doesn't suggest a lack of housing supply at the turn of the century. This must mean that demand for housing has increased in Allegany County. The main determinants of the demand for housing are demographic.

The Census Bureau had Allegany County the lowest of all the Maryland counties for median value of owner occupied housing for the 2006 - 2008 period. Even compared to the adjacent counties, only Somerset County, Pennsylvania, had a lower median value. Compared to a bedroom community like Howard County, Allegany County has a higher percentage of detached single units, 68% versus 53.8%, even though the median value is less than a fourth of that for Howard County.

The recession has, however, impacted the number and value of residential permits being issued in Allegany County. The value of commercial permits though is the second best it has been since the year 2000. The number of commercial permits is only off a few from the average for the period.

The number of employed Allegany County residents had climbed 8% from 2000 to 2006, from 31,035 to 33,663. The recession has caused the number of employed to decrease 6.7% since then to 31,412 in 2010. While the unemployment rate for the County remains above that for the state overall, the gap narrowed to less than two percentage points in 2002 and has stayed that narrow since then. The unemployment rate for the County is now trending with that for Maryland, rather than for the United States overall, falling below that for the country for the first time in 2009, looking as far back as 1980 and staying below in 2010.

The reported number of jobs in Allegany County's economy had increased from 30,076 in 2000 to 30,266 in 2005. Since then they have fallen to 29,129. The Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation estimates that the reported jobs account for 93% of all jobs.

Mineral County, West Virginia, is considered part of the Cumberland Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). The 2000 U.S. Census found 85% of employed Allegany County residents working in the County and 4% working in Mineral County. A 2009 random sampling of households in Allegany County by the Allegany County Department of Economic Development found 80% of employed workers work in Allegany County and another 9% work in Mineral County. The reported number of jobs in Mineral County has increased 1,152 between the years 2000 and 2009. Most of this increase is due to ATK Tactical Systems Company. Local employment at the company has increased over 900 between 2000 and today. Likely, at least 40% of ATK's employees live in Allegany County.

Executive Summary (Continued)

Compared to all other Maryland counties and adjacent counties, Allegany County has the lowest percentage of workers that work outside of their home county. Further, only 6% work beyond one of the adjacent counties. Since two other states are adjacent, however, if a person works outside the county then they tend to also work outside the state. This puts Allegany County fourth among Maryland counties for this interaction. For adjacent counties though, Hampshire and Mineral workers have even more interaction with other states.

Comparing the change from 2000 to 2009, five sectors still account for 70% of the employment in Allegany County, each accounting for at least 10%. Manufacturing, however, has been replaced by State Government. In 2000, Manufacturing provided the best wage after Federal jobs. In 2009, State Government provided a wage as good as did Manufacturing. The biggest increase in wages has been for Natural Resources/Mining from \$476 to \$787, but it employs only 90, down from 109 in 2000. In the year 2000, there were six companies employing 500 employees or more, now there are 10. Overall employment among the companies employing 100 or more has increased 6%, from 11,110 in the year 2000 to 11,785 in 2009 - 2010.

Management/Professional, Service and Sales now make up three quarters of the jobs in Allegany County. Percentagewise since 2000, Service jobs have increased and Production/Transportation jobs have decreased. Compared to Maryland, Allegany County has 16.6 percentage points fewer Management/Professional jobs.

The estimated Gross Regional Product for Allegany County in constant 2004 dollars has climbed steadily from 1992 to 2007, from \$1.57 billion to \$1.85 billion. In 2007, however, it decreased 3.8%.

From 2000 to 2008, per capita personal income increased more in Allegany County, 44.4%, than in the country overall, 32.5% and for the state, 38.9%. In one year, from 2007 to 2008, it increased 5.9% compared to 2.0% for the United States and 2.7% for Maryland. In 2008, the median household income in Allegany County was the best it's been since 1999 as a percent of that for the United States, and second best, it's been compared to Maryland. From 2004 to 2007, the net taxable income for the County increased 8.2% yearly compared to 3.5% yearly for 1980 - 2004. In 2008, however, it decreased 6.6%

While overall public school enrollment continues to decline, the rate of decline is only 1% a year. Furthermore, the details reveal positive results. Kindergarten enrollment after reaching a low in 2004 is up 2.5% since then. Elementary school enrollment is declining less than overall enrollment, and is up for 2010. Most of the decline in overall enrollment is due to fewer middle and high school students.



Allegany County lies in Western Maryland, and is bounded on the west by Garrett County, Maryland; on the east by Washington County, Maryland; on the north by Somerset, Bedford, and Fulton Counties, Pennsylvania; and on the south by Mineral, Hampshire, and Morgan Counties, West Virginia.

The County's boundaries are the Chisholm line on the west, the Mason-Dixon line on the north, Sideling Hill Creek on the east, and the Potomac River on the south. The County is about 40 miles long from east to west and varies from 5 to 20 miles wide from north to south, comprising an area 428 square miles or 274,519 acres.

The County lies in the Potomac River Basin, and in the Appalachian Mountains, partly in the Ridge and Valley Physiographic Province, and partly in the Allegheny Mountains Physiographic Province. The County also lies entirely within the Potomac River Basin and the Chesapeake Bay Drainage area.

Allegany County was officially established in 1789 from land that was part of Washington County. Until 1872, present day Garrett County was a part of Allegany County.




Proximity to Metropolitan Areas Allegany County, Maryland




Adjacent Counties Allegany County, Maryland



Major Towns and Roads Allegany County, Maryland




Historical and Forecasted Population, Forecast from State Government Allegany County, Maryland 1930 - 2030

Forecasted % Increases in Population Allegany County, Maryland, and Adjacent Counties 2000 - 2030







Net Migration, Intra-State Versus Inter-State Allegany County, Maryland 2000 - 2008



Net Migration for Allegany County, Maryland with Washington County, Maryland 2000 - 2008







2000





Age Group Amounts Allegany County, Maryland 1990, 2000 and 2008 Estimate





Births and Deaths Allegany County, Maryland 1970 - 2009





2000 - 2009





1970 - 2009









Median Value for Residential Sales Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 2000 - 2010





Median Value for Residential Sales Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States Monthly for 2010





Median Value of All Owner Occupied Housing Units Maryland Counties 2006 - 2008 Estimate





Median Value of All Owner Occupied Housing Units Adjacent Counties to Allegany County, Maryland 2006 - 2008 Estimate





Residential Units Sold Allegany County 2000 - 2010





Residential Units Sold Allegany County Monthly for 2010





Single Family Dwelling Permits Issued Allegany County, Maryland, Including Cumberland and Frostburg 2000 - 2010





Commercial Permits Issued Allegany County, Maryland, Including Cumberland and Frostburg 2000 - 2010









Annual Unemployment Rate Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 1980 - 2010





Annual Unemployment Rate Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 2007 - 2010





Annual Unemployment Rate Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 2010





Resident Labor Force and Resident Employment Annual Averages Allegany County, Maryland 2000 - 2010




Annual Employment Averages, Local (Estimated*) Versus Resident Allegany County, Maryland 2000 - 2009




Annual Employment Averages, Local (Estimated*) Versus Resident Mineral County, West Virginia 2000 - 2009




Annual Employment Averages, Local for MSA and County (Estimated*) Versus County Resident Allegany County, Maryland, 2000 - 2009




Annual Employment Averages, Local (Estimated*) Versus Resident Cumberland MSA (Allegany and Mineral Counties) 2000 - 2009




% of Workers (16 and Older) Working Outside Resident County Maryland Counties 2006 - 2008 Estimate




% of Workers (16 and Older) Working Outside Resident County Adjacent Counties to Allegany County, Maryland 2006 - 2008 Estimate





Gross Regional Product Estimate* Allegany County, Maryland 1969 - 2007





Total Personal Income Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 1969 - 2008





Per Capita Personal Income Allegany County Compared to Maryland and United States 1978 - 2008







Maryland Compared to United States and Adjacent States




Annual Tax Rate*

2000 - 2009




Maryland Resident Tax Returns Filed by Allegany County, Maryland, Residents 1980 - 2008





Net Taxable Income Allegany County, Maryland 1980 - 2008










Public School Enrollment Allegany County, Maryland 1980 - 2010




Public School Enrollment by Grade Group Allegany County, Maryland 1980 - 2010
