

We're Well Connected. You Can Be, Too.

As with all real estate decisions, location is of the utmost importance. For a business, the site location can greatly impact the ease of doing business and determine a company's success. Establishing connections can be difficult, which is why factors like transportation and infrastructure can increase the value of a site's location.

Our region is well connected by water, land, air and rail, and it is well equipped to meet the needs of international business. St. Clair County boasts excellent highway accessibility, with both U.S. and Canadian connections to nearby Detroit, Chicago, London and Toronto. In addition, our region offers stable, state-of-the-art infrastructure and multi-modal assets to support global commerce.

Land

- Major expressways include I-94, I-69 (U.S.); and Highway 402 (Canada)
- International Blue Water Bridge accommodates both cargo and passenger vehicles
- Two Class-1 railroads with double-stack cargo capacity into Ontario (CSX, CN North America)

Air

• St. Clair County International Airport, plus two major nearby airports: Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Flint Bishop International Airport

- 24' deep-water port access with rail spur (no dredging required)
- 220 miles of surface water
- St. Clair River connects Lake Huron and Lake St. Clair, forming our border with Ontario, Canada, and serving as the Great Lakes shipping channel to the St. Lawrence Seaway and Atlantic Ocean. Approximately 5,000 vessels pass through the St. Clair River annually

Invest in Blue, See Green

In addition to well-connected transportation links, St. Clair County's HubZone and Foreign Trade Zone designations can help your business thrive as a global competitor by saving you time and money.

What is a Foreign Trade Zone?

St. Clair County has been awarded status as a Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ), a designation that helps companies achieve dramatic savings related to international commerce. Some of the key advantages of an FTZ can include relief from inverted tariffs; duty exemption on re-exports; duty elimination on waste, scrap and yield loss; weekly entry savings; and duty deferral.

What is a HUBZone?

The Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone) Empowerment Contracting program stimulates economic development and creates jobs in urban and rural communities by providing federal contracting preference to small businesses. Relocating your small business to St. Clair County is the first step in reaping the benefits of this lucrative program.

Business Beyond Borders

Mobility is one of the most important characteristics of economic activity within a region. As the northern entry point of the NAFTA corridor, St. Clair County makes moving goods, materials and people easy. With multi-modal assets supporting travel by highway, water, air and rail, St. Clair County provides quick and easy access to larger markets in the U.S. and Canada as well as access to key suppliers in the automotive, alternative energy and defense industries.

ROAD

Two major interstate highways originate at the Blue Water Bridge and provide express service to Detroit, Flint, Chicago, Toronto and Upstate New York.

Interstate 69

I-69 runs west to Flint, Michigan, and south to Indianapolis, Indiana and Texas via I-70.

Interstate 94

I-94 is the primary east-west freeway route through Michigan, extending through Chicago into the western United States.

RAIL

St. Clair County offers two class-1 railroads with double-stack capacity:

CN North America

CN North America connects with Canadian carriers via the international tunnel and to southern railways via the Chicago Hub.

CSX

CSX connects as far west as Chicago, as far south as Florida, and to Canadian railroads via the international tunnel.

PORT

One deep-water port with potential for a second multi-modal port of 24'.

Seaway Terminal

The Seaway Terminal accommodates various-size vessels and shipments and offers excellent highway access and a nearby regional airport.

AIR

An international airport serves as a port of entry, offering U.S. Customs and Immigration services.

St. Clair County International Airport

St. Clair County International provides air cargo transportation and complete aircraft services. It is equipped with two 5100' and one 4000' paved runways and parallel taxiways with lights, NDB, DME, PAPI and instrument landing system.

Passenger airline service for domestic and international travel is available within an hour or less at Flint Bishop International Airport (FNT) or Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW), which services more than 160 non-stop destinations around the globe. Also, Great Lakes Airport located in Sarnia, Ontario, offers connecting service to locations throughout Canada.

PORT-SPECIFIC

The Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Seaway system provides access to global shipping destinations via Port Huron's Seaway Terminal. There are more than 65 ports throughout the system, including 15 major international ports.

Port Huron Museum

The Port Huron Museum is the area's largest cultural institution, with exhibitions and public programs dedicated to fine arts, decorative arts, natural history, local history and Great Lakes maritime lore.

Fort Gratiot Lighthouse

The Fort Gratiot Lighthouse, which was the first in Michigan, marks the entrance to the St. Clair River from Lake Huron. It is surrounded by a public park and beach in addition to an active Coast Guard facility.

Thomas Edison Depot

Built in the actual depot out of which Thomas Edison worked as a "news butcher" selling snacks and newspapers, the museum is filled with interactive exhibits about Edison's life and inventions.

Studio 1219 Art Incubator

The largest public art facility in Michigan's Thumb Region and a community event space, Studio 1219 is home to a fine art gallery, pottery studio, solo artist gallery, gallery gift shop and several small arts-related businesses.
