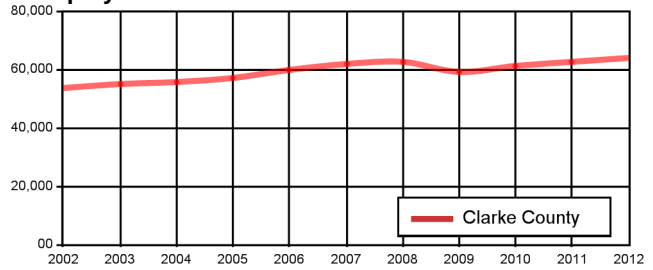

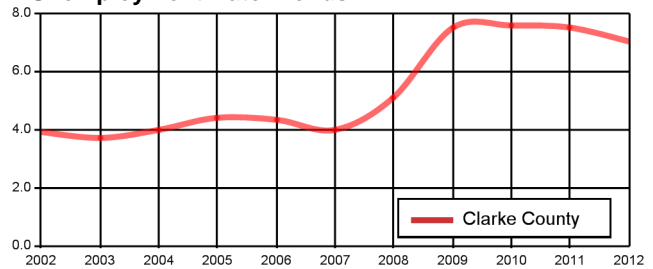

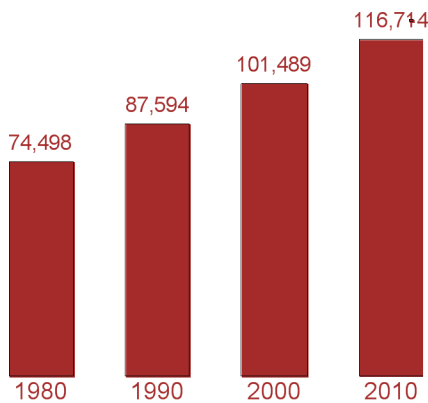
Employment Trends

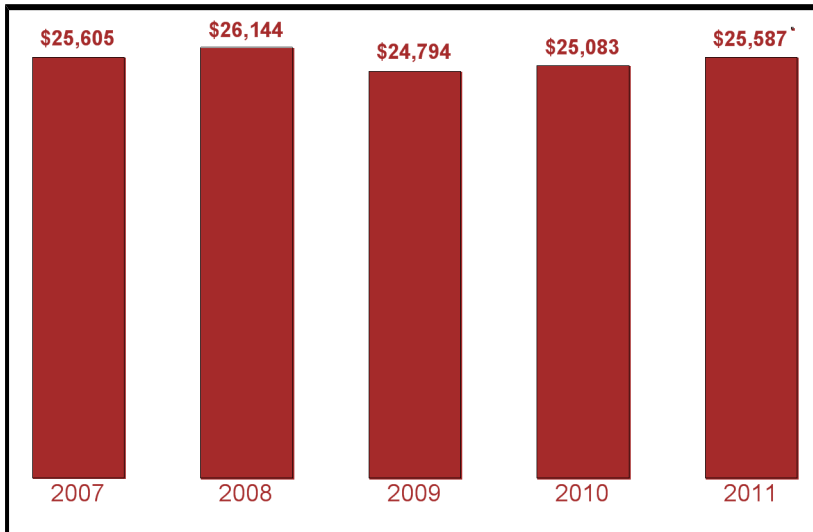

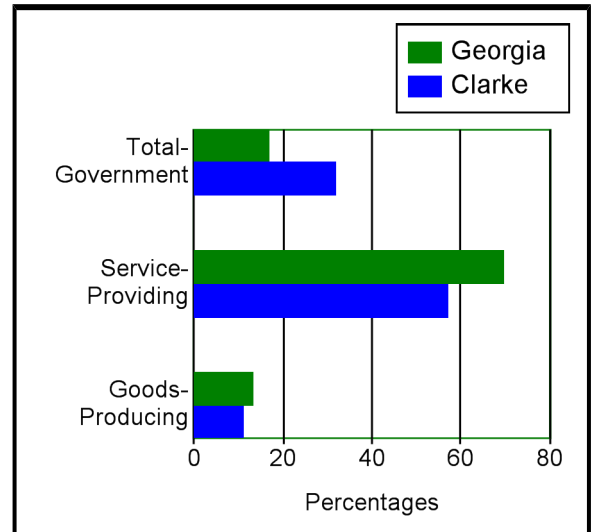
Clarke Per Capita Income
