# **Dodge City** Ranked in Kansas in **Economic Strength among Micropolitan Communities** (10,000 to 50,000 in population)




# National Ranking Economic Strength


# "Why Not Dodge?" Sales Tax Community Support



#### United Wireless Arena - \$55 Million / 2008

A host to almost 400 diverse events to over 90,000 guests in 2014. The Arena and Conference Center offers availability of space for concerts, family shows, wedding receptions, conferences, ice skating, and more.

Legends Park - \$3.5 Million / 2000 Ranked as a premier baseball/softball complex in the state and throughout the region and home to multiple tournaments.



In 1997, our community passed a sales tax to build several entertainment facilities to enhance tourism and improve the quality of life in Dodge City. The projects completed include: an outdoor motorsports complex, improvements to a 2,600 seat civic center, and tournament facilities for baseball/softball and soccer. Additionally, our 4,500 seat multi-purpose Special Events/Convention Center is complete and has been in operation since 2011. It is the premier event and concert location in western Kansas, drawing national concerts, comedy shows and various sports and family events. Most recently approved and under construction is the new aquatics facility in the Heritage District.

## \$85.6 Million School Bond Passes!

With increasing student enrollment, the Dodge City school district faced several significant challenges. In moving forward, the community was asked what they saw as the districts most pressing needs in areas ranging from facilities and class sizes, to safety and security. A Visioning Team was created to explore the current status of the facilities and communicate with the community.

In June 2015, voters easily approved an \$85.6 million school bond with a resounding yes with the use of mail ballots. Upgrades and improvements will be made to nearly all of the school buildings while the mill levy remains the same.




# Local & Private Investments **Partnerships**

#### Boot Hill Casino & Resort - \$50 Million - 2009

Annually, Boot Hill Casino & Resort brings over 600,000 visitors to Dodge City, 90% of which are from outside of Dodge City. Additionally, Boot Hill Casino has directly contributed approximatelhy \$6 million in local tax revenue and contributions to local non-profit agencies.








## **Dodge City Days**

The 10-day Dodge City Days celebration is the second largest festival in the Kansas and celebrated its 55th year in 2015.
