Houston - Greenspoint District

More than 3,700 energy-related establishments do business in the Houston region, earning the area its recognition as "Energy Capital of the World."

Supporting these companies is a vast energy talent pool of some 254,186 workers in a wide array of disciplines.

Nearly half of Houston's economic activity is driven by the energy industry.

The Greenspoint District, known as the downtown of Houston's north side, is one of the region's key energy corridors, containing over 100 energy-related businesses.

What draws these companies to the north side? The ease of access to vendors, markets and employees via freeways crossing and bounding Greenspoint. The North Sam Houston Parkway, Interstate 45 and the Hardy Toll Road make it easy to get around the city and around the world.

Room to Grow

The Greenspoint District contains some 20 million square feet of commercial development and more than 1,500 acres of developable land. Whether you're seeking a site on which to build or an existing location, Greenspoint has ample room to grow.

The 11 million-square-foot office sector has a 16-percent overall vacancy rate. With rental rates about 30 percent below the Houston average, Greenspoint is a great value for cost-conscious companies. Even in the District's tighter class A office sector, where vacancy rates rarely rise above 5 percent, opportunities abound as over 660,000 square feet will open in the next 12 months.

Similar opportunities exist in the industrial sector, which has close to 1 million square feet of space available for lease.

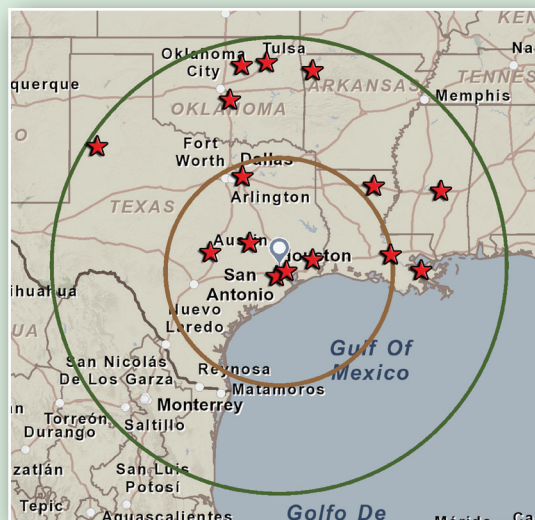
Workforce to Fill Demand

The high demand for engineers in the energy sector is creating workforce shortages in many areas of the United States. Universities across the energy-industry-laden south are working to fill that demand. A survey of major universities within a 500-mile radius of Houston shows the following:

- 42,880 students enrolled in undergraduate engineering programs
- 2,296 student enrolled in graduate level engineering programs

In 2012, these engineering programs awarded bachelor's degrees to over 6,000 students and post-graduate degrees to another 3,600 students.
