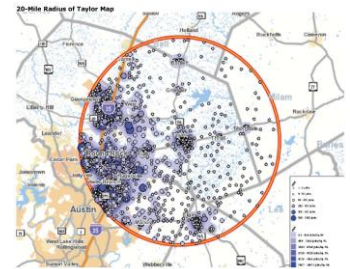

Demographic Overview

Taylor's population of 16,061 (*ESRI's 2010 census estimate*) is located in Williamson County, Texas, the nation's 8th fastest growing county that has more than 300,000 population. For detailed information on demographics, visit our [Demographics](#) page.

More than 100,000 people live within a 15-mile drive of Taylor, up 73% since 2000 and over one-half million people are in the labor force within a 30-mile radius of Taylor (*Occupation and Employment 2008, SitesOnTexas*). In the next five years, an additional 100,000 new residents are expected to move to the 15-mile area surrounding our City.




