Even though Wylie has experienced phenomenal growth, infrastructure improvements have allowed the city to accommodate this growth in stride. Wylie residents recently approved a bond package totaling more than \$73 million earmarked for infrastructure and municipal complex improvements so that Wylie can continue to meet the demanding needs of the growing population.

Expanding Transportation

Wylie is served by the President George Bush Tollway via a 4 lane divided State Highway 78 and U.S. 75 (Central Expressway) via a 6 lane divided F.M. 544. State Highway 78 is scheduled to be expanded to a six lane divided highway beginning in 2009. Internal transportation improvements scheduled to begin in 2009 and 2010 include:

- Expanding F.M. 1378 to six lane divided from F.M. 544 to Parker Road
- Expanding Brown Street to four lane divided from F.M. 1378 to Ballard Street
- Expanding Brown Street to four lane divided from State Highway 78 to Stone Road

Technology

Located within the North Texas Telecom Corridor, Wylie has excellent access to an array of up-to-date technology and technology infrastructure. Wylie is also one of the few cities in the nation to offer fiber optic transmission lines direct to the home to provide enough bandwidth to cover the future needs for many years to come. Currently these fiber optic lines installed by Verizon provide high speed data transmission (up to 30mbps), on-demand television service, and telephone service.
