


# We're a top-10 U.S. port and more.

The Port of Lake Charles is a deepwater seaport in Lake Charles, Louisiana — located on the Calcasieu Ship Channel. It's the nation's 10th-busiest port district, based on tonnage.

The Port also manages the Calcasieu Ship Channel. In all, the port district encompasses 203 square miles as "America's Energy Corridor," the world's No. 1 LNG export area.

# **New ability** to serve you

Louisiana's growing Port of Lake Charles is a top-10 U.S. deepwater port district, based on U.S. Commerce Department tonnage statistics.

Additional capacity and capability has been created by the addition of a state-of-the-art ship loader to Bulk Terminal 1, significantly strengthening capacity for heavy bulk cargo operations. The loader — 174 feet tall, weighing 900 tons — represents a \$14 million investment. It brings BT-1's tally to two high-capacity ship loaders capable of simultaneous vessel servicing.

BT-1 already handles more than 3.1 million short tons of dry bulk—such as petroleum coke, calcined coke, barite, and rutile—each year.

# **National** impact

Cargo activity at the port and Calcasieu Ship Channel supported \$83.4 billion in total U.S. economic **value** in 2024:

- \$27.5 billion in personal wage and salary income and consumption expenditures nationwide.
- \$2.9 billion in tax revenue nationwide.
- \$5.5 billion in federal tax revenue.
