#### **Transportation**

Located halfway between New York and Miami, our region is made up of nine counties in northeastern South Carolina. Regional transportation infrastructure includes:

- I-95 (N/S), I-20 (E/W) and the proposed I-73 (NW/SE).
- Florence Regional Airport and Myrtle Beach International Airport.
- The Port of Georgetown, a breakbulk port with four berths and includes open and covered storage and an on-terminal CSX rail connection.
- Over 350 miles of rail.

The region also provides excellent access to South Carolina's Port of Charleston which has five terminals (3 container, 2 breakbulk) and the ability to handle post-Panamax vessels.
