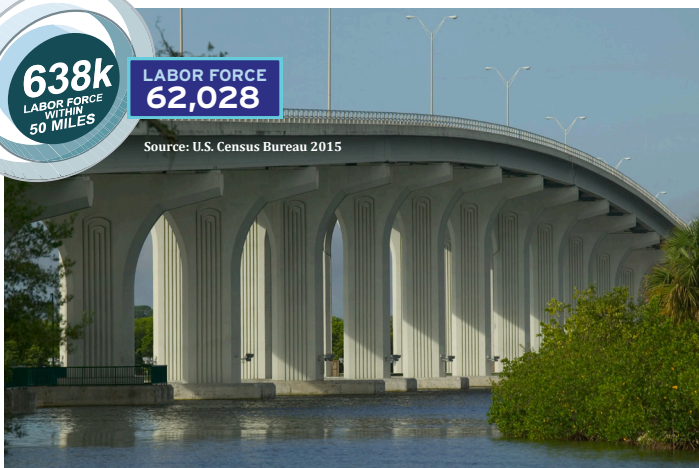
## Professional, Scientific & Technical Services

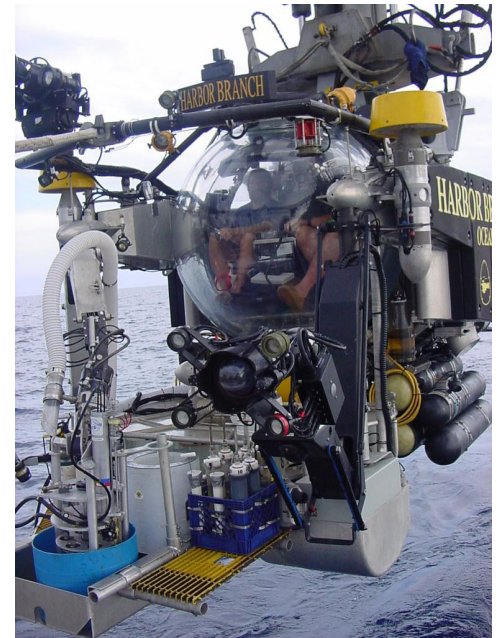
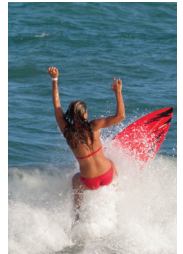
